



MISSION STATEMENT

Chatfield College is an open-enrollment Catholic college, rooted in the Legacy of the Ursuline Sisters, believing in the potential of every person, and accepting of people of all faiths. We offer a small collaborative learning environment with a deep sense of community, and personalized support. Chatfield meets students where they are and empowers individuals to better themselves, their employability, and their future.

WHO WE ARE

Chatfield College is the only private, Catholic, three year liberal arts college in the State of Ohio. Chatfield is authorized to grant an Associate of Arts Degree in Liberal Arts with concentrations in Business, Human Services, Child Development, and Liberal Arts.

The Ursulines of Brown County, who settled in St. Martin in 1845, founded Chatfield in 1971. The main campus is located on 200 wooded acres in northern Brown County. The Cincinnati site is located in the Over-the-Rhine neighborhood in downtown Cincinnati.

WHAT WE OFFER

A student satisfaction inventory administered by Noel-Levitz found that Chatfield College far exceeded the national comparison group in all categories, including: student centeredness, instructional effectiveness, registration effectiveness, campus climate, concern for the individual, academic advising/counseling, service excellence, admissions and financial aid, academic services, safety and security, and campus support services.

ACADEMICS

- Chatfield College requires 64 semester credit hours for the Associate of Arts Degree.
- Programs of study include Business, Early Childhood Education, Human Services (including community health, criminal justice, and social work) and Liberal Arts.
- Chatfield students can complete three years at Chatfield toward a four year degree.
- Hours earned at Chatfield are transferable to four year institutions, such as Xavier University, the University of Cincinnati, Northern Kentucky University, Wilmington College, and the College of Mount St. Joseph.
- Classes meet once per week, during day and evening hours to accommodate employment and family schedules.
- Chatfield offers a number of named, endowed scholarships, funded by income generated specified donor funds.

THE COLLEGE

- Member of the Greater Cincinnati Collegiate (GC3), Ursuline Education Network (UEN), and Association of Catholic Colleges and Universities (ACCU)
- Authorized by the Ohio Board of Regents to grant the Associate of Arts Degree, plus a third year towards a bachelor's degree

STUDENTS

- More than 500 full or part-time students per year from Adams, Brown, Butler, Clermont, Clinton, Highland, Hamilton and Warren counties as well as Boone, Campbell, and Kenton counties in Northern Kentucky
- Approximately 52% are of traditional age or younger; 48% are over age 24
- Ratio of women to men is 3:1
- At the St. Martin Campus, most are of Appalachian heritage; at the Cincinnati Campus, most are of African American heritage
- Approximately 65% of Chatfield graduates transfer to four year colleges and 56% earn a bachelor's degree

TUITION AND FINANCIAL AID

- Tuition is comparable to state colleges and universities
- 98% of full time students receive financial aid

ALUMNI

- More than 1,350 alumni
- 56% have earned bachelor's degrees
- 50% have earned job promotions
- 90% credit Chatfield for helping them to lead more productive lives

FACULTY

- Student to faculty ratio is 11:1; average class size is 5-15
- 75 faculty members; 98% have advanced degrees

STAFF

- 50 staff members

- 28 active trustees
- 2 honorary trustees

STUDENT SERVICES

Staff members are available to assist students with academic and career counseling as well as financial counseling. Chatfield also has access to a broad network of service providers who can assist students with personal counseling needs.

Chatfield College offers a mentoring program which matches students with volunteer mentors from the community for support, encouragement, and guidance as students balance their personal lives with academic expectations.

Chatfield College offers a variety of student activities throughout the academic year. All activities are open to family, friends, and the neighboring community.

The Chatfield College Library provides peer tutors to students who need assistance in the areas of writing, math, and computers.

SPECIAL EVENTS

Chatfield College hosts events, such as the Car, Craft & Quilt Show and the 5K Run, annual outings to the Cincinnati Reds and the Cincinnati Cyclones, as well as performances by professional musicians, actors and students. The college also holds community coffees and library teas, which are open to the community.

COMMUNITY SERVICES

The Chatfield College Library is a full service library offering one-on-one instruction, library presentations, and help finding reliable information. Resources include interlibrary loan, as well as a collection of books, newspaper, periodicals, and DVDs. In addition, the Chatfield College Library contains a collection of children's literature and a number of small special collections, such as the Quilt Collection, the Ohio Collection, and the Appalachian Collection. The library also offers a number of cultural activities, a book club, and teas.

- With prior arrangement, Chatfield College facilities are available for community organizations to use for meetings and social events.
- Chatfield faculty and staff are on the boards of a number of community organizations.
- Both Chatfield College locations have wireless internet throughout.

NOTEWORTHY NEWS

- Chatfield has entered into partnerships with four year institutions who offer bachelor's degrees in a variety of concentrations.
- Chatfield College has approved the Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy for credit toward the Associate of Arts degree in Liberal Arts.
- Chatfield College is one of only three approved programs in the state of Ohio authorized to offer coursework leading to the Community Health Worker Certification, an entry level certificate and an excellent stepping stone to a professional career in the human services and medical fields.
- Chatfield College has been approved by the Ohio Counselor, Social Work, and Marriage and Family Therapist Board to offer a program leading to a certificate of registration to practice as a social work assistant.
- The Early Childhood Education Concentration at Chatfield College includes course content specific to the training requirements for the Child Development Associate certification. Chatfield College is approved by the Child Development Association Council to provide the coursework necessary for the CDA certificate.
